MANCHESTER TO NEW MILLS CENTRAL AND SHEFFIELD SERVICES

We are delighted to be able to report that Network Rail completed all the work necessary so that the line to New Mills and Sheffield could reopen as planned on Monday 23rd September.



So we now have a full train service back in operation. The picture above shows the 11.06 to Sheffield on Tuesday 24th September arriving to Platform 2.

Some work is still being carried out in the Hague Bar area of New Mills but it doesn't affect the use of the line.

So in addition to a full passenger service freight trains are again coming through Romiley. Below is a stone train pictured on Tuesday 24th September heading from Great Rocks Junction to sidings at Ashburys

VANDALISM

For example:

- Island nation that was the birth place of both singer Rihanna and cricketer Sir Garfield Sobers, who was born in its capital Bridgetown (3)
- Another island nation which straddles both the equator and the 180th meridian once known as the Gilbert islands (2)
- South Asian landlocked country that includes part of Mount Everest (1)
- Only country to have a land border with Denmark (1)

Answers are:

BARbados, KIribati, Nepal and Germany – So the station is BARKING

Station No. 1

- South American country that has a yellow, blue and red flag whose President is a former guerrilla group member, Gustavo Petro. (2)
- Another South American country that borders the country above which boasts the tallest waterfall in the world (3)
- A Caribbean country that at its closest point is only 11 kilometres from the country above. It hosts Test match cricket at the Queen's Park Oval (2)
- The country featured in the film where fishing expert Alfred Jones, played by Ewan McGregor, went to in the hope of introducing salmon fishing (1)

Station No. 2

- An Asian country created on 16th December 1971 out of West Pakistan (2)
- The musical The King and I starring Yul Brynner was set in this country but at that time it was called Siam (2)
- Country that beat England 2 1 in this year's UEFA Euro Cup final (2)

Station No. 3

- Joined the EU in 2004 this country borders the Mediterranean Sea. Its highest mountain is Triglav which before this country's independence in 1991 was the highest peak in what was then Yugoslavia (3)
- The only double landlocked country in Asia (1)
- Into Africa now for a country whose capital is Accra (2)

Station No. 4

- Plays host to the claim of housing the only man made structure that can be seen clearly from space with the naked eye (2)
- The Baltic Sea and with it the Gulf of Finland lies to the north of this country and Latvia to the south (3)
- An east African country that has an extensive coastline along the Red Sea. In 1941 the British took over the administration of the country following the Battle of Keren (2)

Station No. 5

- Officially this European country is a Grand Duchy that is landlocked and its capital city shares its name with that of the country (2)
- This country is yet another island nation being an archipelago in the Southern Pacific Ocean. It is a constitutional monarchy ruled over by King Tupou VI (3)

Station No. 6

- Home to some of the most scenic rail journeys in Europe, such as the Ofoten, Røros and Rauma Lines, this country even has a railway line that's inside the Artic Circle (4)
- Shares its name with a supermarket chain but better known as an island nation that has extensive geothermal activity. Indeed Surtsey, one of the youngest islands in the world was created by volcanic action between 1963 and 1968 (2)
- Yet another landlocked European country that is crossed by both the Tisza and Danube Rivers, the latter passing through its capital city (1)

- Central America now for this country which is known as the land of volcanos. It is the only Central American country that without a coastline on the Caribbean Sea. Its national bird is the Torogoz (3)
- The equator passes through this South American country that includes the Galapagos Islands (2)
- Another South American country, its second largest, whose name appeared in a well-known song in the Time Rice musical Evita (2)

Station No. 8


- Thought to be the site of the ancient Dilmun civilization this country on the Persion Gulf is linked to Saudi Arabia by the King Fahd Causeway (2)
- With an Atlantic Ocean coastline this African country gets its name from its coastal desert that is the oldest in the world. Having gained independence on 21st March 1990 it remains a commonwealth country (2)
- A communist country in Asia whose tallest building is a supertall skyscraper named Landmark 81 (after its 81 storeys) that overlooks the Saigon River (2)

Station No. 9

• Just one country for this station and it's one of South America's two landlocked countries, but not the one beginning with "B". Its official languages are both Spanish and Guaraní (3)
