They were no longer required, having out lived their usefulness, so we were delighted when Northern gifted them to us so that they could be converted into planters rather than simply being removed from the station and disposed of.

We made an application to the Transport for Greater Manchester Small Grant Fund which was quickly approved thus giving us funding for their conversion to planters and with it a new lease of life.

We also worked closely with Romiley & Marple Lions, especially Phil Daniels who is also one of our active members, as it is they who kindly help us maintain all our other planters at the station as well as the Platinum Jubilee Garden.



Becky Styles at Northern arranged for everything in the containers to be removed before Phil set about removing the lids.

Thereafter they were painted in a suitable green colour, which matched the wooden containers already in place, before filling each one with suitable material to assist

drainage plus compost and soil. He then finished off the job by planting each one with two perennials, violas, grasses and bulbs (primarily small daffodil bulbs) that will come into flower next spring.





Each of the new planters were already bolted to the platforms so they will not be moving anywhere fast should anyone have the urge to do so.

We are, therefore, extremely grateful not only to Northern for letting us convert the disused containers but also to TfGM who kindly met bulk of the cost of conversion



and planting. In addition the Lions Club have met some of the cost.



On the face of it this was very much a small project but one that we feel will provide yet more colour to the station and improve its overall environment.

A 'TREE'MENDOUS FOOD AND DRINK STATIONS QUIZ

This month we have taken the names of 32 stations on the national network. Each station contains within it either the name of a tree or something that you could eat or drink.

The trouble is we have mixed everything up, although to make it a bit easier we have put the mixed up stations in two columns of 16. You have to swap a tree, drink or food item from the first column with a similar one in the second column. You always swap a tree with a tree, a drink with a drink or a food item with a food item and each swap will also have the same number of letters in it.

To show you how it works take number 1 WILLOW TREE in the first column.

You can see that WILLOW is a 6 letter tree so look for a 6 letter tree in the second column that when swapped with WILLOW will give you two correctly named stations.

In column 2 you will find CHERRY which you can swap with WILLOW to give you two stations, namely CHERRY TREE and NEWTON LE WILLOW.

Is as simple as that. Good luck.
